## 5 Day Bible Reading Plan

Tragically, the statistics for Bible reading and study amongst evangelical Christians are not very encouraging. One statistic I saw recently suggests that the average pastor spends only 15 minutes per day reading and praying over God's Word.

So that we do not become what these statistics reveal, we have prepared a reading plan designed to help us read through the whole Bible in a year. This is a 5 Day chronological programme developed by

the late Dr R C Sproul (Ligonier Ministries) that mercifully allows time for catch up and reflection on what has been read at weekends!

## Tanzania Update

## Zeph & Wema's sabbatical in UK.

Zeph & Wema thanked us for hosting them for their month's sabbatical. They went back to Tanzania to take up the reigns again in December. It was lovely seeing them slowly relax and unwind and enjoy the cold, wet Britain in the middle of 'Brexit' and election fever.

Zeph reports that his family, Church, Youth, Nursery School and the Health Centre all

survived his absence as he had put good plans in place, delegating the work before he went.

## The growth of the Church in Tanzania continues.

Hope Community Church helps support mission outreach from Zeph's church in Dodoma. They are now reaching into the unreached regions in Southern Tanzania and the Mozambique border.

An elder from the church: Mefruda is choosing to give up his life of relative comfort in Dodoma and go south with his wife to face the very real risks of church planting there, in a very poor Muslim area. The spiritual (and possibly physical) warfare will be intense.

I know Mefruda from building Tazama na Tunza Health Centre as he was the glue that kept the building being built and ensured everything went in place in the right time and way. I know his wife as she had cerebral malaria when I was nursing there (she was so unwell that she ran around outside church naked in her fever,



and the church elders had to try and catch her to take her home, but they couldn't as they were trying to catch her with their eyes shut!). She fully recovered and is now a beautiful church elder and is very brave to consider church planting in the south with Mefruda. I will update you on their story: meanwhile, please pray for them as they prepare to go.

#### **Please Pray**

Please continue to pray for the **Health Centre**. We need to continue to challenge the culture of only going to hospital when you think you are dying, and to encourage the community to come to us earlier in order to prevent diseases and disabilities and to treat the early symptoms.

Please pray for this culture change and for the Government **Fridge** to arrive for the **Mamas Unit!** Please father, release the fridge to us so that we can start treating the mothers and babies in the area, saving lives and preventing disabilities. We also now have to pay for the **Public Health Nurse** to cover this work as the Government said that they are no longer paying for them.



#### Youth decision time.

18-30 year-olds are invited to Tanzania this year so please fill in your form to come to Tanzania if you feel that this is God's path ahead for you. We can trust God for the money for travelling as time moves forward, but for now I need to know who is knowing the Holy Spirit's promptings to come...

Thank you Father that we can join with you in partnership across all the cultural and language divides to build your Kingdom here on earth. **Ruth**
