As we continue to review the unchanging values of Hope Community Church, we come this month to our declared intention to be a Word & Spirit church.

Word & Spirit is a commonly-used phrase in the Christian community these days, so it is important to be clear about what we mean by this phrase. We shall consider **Word** this month, and Spirit in March's Insight.

By Word, we are signalling our firm conviction that the Bible is the revelation of God, every word inspired without error in the original writings which are the Old (39 books) and New (27 books) Testaments. We affirm that the Bible alone has final authority for Christian

faith and life. In this sense, we are "evangelical" in the original sense of that word.

But we intend to say more than this by saying we are a Word church.

We are also indicating that we are "reformed" in our understanding of Scripture. By this we mean that we hold to a very high view of the sovereignty of God over everything, in both the seen and the unseen realities. We affirm that nothing happens in heaven, on earth or in our lives that God has not permitted and that he will not use for his glory and for the ultimate good of those who have faith in him.

that God alone is the author and perfecter of our faith. We affirm our mighty Saviour: in Christ alone, by grace alone, though faith alone, in God's Word alone and for God's glory alone.

By asserting this **Word** foundation, we are also signifying our

commitment to really knowing God, deeply, intimately, through his self-revelation in the Scriptures. To this end we are committed to teaching the full counsel of God, in season and out of season, and through faithful exposition to uncover what the Bible actually says about

God and his ways, not just what we want it to

By describing ourselves as a Word church, we are also communicating our devotion to learning, defending and applying the apostles' teaching. We do this, not out of mere academic interest, but also to experience the supernatural power of the gospel transforming our lives, our community, our culture and our world so that God's kingdom comes and the whole earth is filled with his glory!

By calling ourselves a **Word** church, we accept that we will experience conflict with the By saying we are a Word church, we are stating secular world-view that prevails in our nation. We know that as our minds are renewed, the new life at work in us will stir up conflict with our confident trust in him alone as the old nature. As we face both external and internal pressure because of the **Word**, we know we will face misunderstanding, opposition and even suffering.

> But we will hold fast to God's Word, because he who inspired it is utterly faithful and all his promises are true.

May God bless you richly as you read, pray and obey!

The comments speak for themselves but I just want to say again a huge thank you to every one who contributed to the day... preparing gift bags, driving, cooking, serving, hosting, singing, decorating and packing away. It's a big job that was made light by the many willing hands and the generous donations.

We had funding from the Jigsaw Foundation, a very competitive price from Mimi's catering, vouchers from Morrisons and Tesco and cash donations from friends at church and the Matinee. Praise God for His provision!
